

THE 5-STEP TAJWEED CHECKLIST FOR BUSY PARENTS

A GUIDE TO HELPING YOUR CHILD RECITE THE QURAN WITH CONFIDENCE & PRECISION

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Assalamu Alaikum! As parents living in a fast-paced environment, we know that ensuring our children have a strong connection with the Holy Quran is our top priority—but it isn't always easy. This checklist is designed to help you identify where your child stands and how to bridge the gap between "reading" and "mastery."

Step 1: Identify the "Big Three" Pronunciation Mistakes

Before your child can master complex rules, they must master the basics. Listen to your child recite and check for these three common slips:

- **The Vowel Slip:** Are they stretching short vowels (*Harakat*) into long ones? (e.g., turning a *Fatha* into an *Alif*).
- **The Heavy Letters:** Are they pronouncing letters like **Qaf (ق)** and **Saad (ص)** with a full, deep mouth, or do they sound "thin" like *Kaf* or *Seen*?
- **The Throat Letters:** Are **'Ayn (ع)** and **Ha (ح)** coming clearly from the middle of the throat, or are they being skipped?



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Step 2: Create a "15-Minute Quran Habit"

Consistency beats intensity every time. You don't need hours; you need a system.

- **The 15-Minute Rule:** Set a timer. 5 minutes of review, 7 minutes of new learning, and 3 minutes of "Beautification" (practicing a melodic tone).
- **The "No-Phone" Zone:** Ensure this time is free from digital distractions to build Khushu (focus) from a young age.

Step 3: Simplify the "Makhraj" (Articulation Points)

Tajweed is a science of the mouth and throat. Help your child visualize where sounds come from:

- **The Lips:** For *Ba, Meem, Waw*.
- **The Tongue:** For the majority of letters.
- **The Throat:** For the "Hidden" letters that require breath control.
- *Tip:* Have your child place their hand on their throat to feel the vibration of the letters. This "physical" learning helps them remember rules faster.

Step 4: The Power of the Female Tutor Connection

For many children, especially young girls and toddlers, the learning environment is everything.

- **Confidence First:** A nurturing female tutor often provides a more comfortable space for shy children to make mistakes and correct them without fear.
- **Role Modeling:** Seeing a professional, Ijazah-certified woman master the Quran inspires daughters to achieve the same level of excellence.

Step 5: Use the "Albakht Rewards" Method at Home
